Frequently Asked Questions about Membership at THCC

Q. Why membership?

A. Connect. Engage. Discover.

By becoming a member of the church, we deepen our connection to the community. As members of the church community, we commit ourselves to one another for mutual growth and support. We want you to consider Talmadge Hill your church home.

Sixteenth-century reformers had the radical belief that people could discover for themselves their own relationship with God. In that spirit, we agree to interpret the Scriptures, both individually and together.

Q. What is the commitment?

A. Above all, it is a commitment to a community of people who desire:

- a deeper connectedness to God and to one another
- the fellowship of other seekers, and
- to make a positive impact on our world

Q. What do we believe?

A. Our church mission is *To Know the Love of God and Share It*. We stand in the Protestant tradition of Pilgrims and Puritans in the affirmation that each individual has the capacity to know God intimately for him-or herself. We use scholarship to understand the Scriptures and to embrace the mystery which is embodied in many church traditions. We believe that the spirit of God is found and experienced in many places and ways - through services performed, and in beauty found in art, music and nature.

Q. What makes THCC stand out?

A. THCC stands out through its blending of preaching, teaching, music, fellowship and commitment to outreach. At least 22% of all income is given to help underserved populations.

Q. How do you treat tithing?

A. Financial support of THCC is voluntary and welcome. We ask members to give what they can and with a happy heart. For planning purposes, we ask members to make annual pledges and the vast majority of the Congregation is able to do so, though it is not required. The average pledge is \$2000 per year, per family. All are welcome, regardless of financial contributions. As a member, you enjoy the support and services of what the church offers to the community.

Q. What does membership involve?

A. At THCC, it should be easy to feel welcomed. The most important requirement is that you would choose to make a commitment to the community of Talmadge Hill Church. All people are welcome to join, and the only requirement is baptism. If one has not yet been baptized, then a ceremony can be arranged.

Q. Why baptism?

A. By tradition, baptism is the mark of entrance into the Christian church. If one desires to be baptized, our ministers can arrange a ceremony that takes place during a church service.

Q. When can I join?

A. Membership Sundays take place approximately twice a year and are held during the 10:00am service. One's joining can be arrange by contacting our ministers, Carter Via and Cheryl Bundy, or a membership liaison, Lisa Michalski and Mary Tilghman.

The Missions Program at Talmadge Hill Community Church

"Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin?"

Talmadge Hill Community Church (THCC) has always appreciated this simple truth – God's Love belongs to everyone. Yet every day, basic needs such as food, clothing, shelter, education, and healthcare are denied vast numbers of people around the world. In the face of these realities, we offer 22% of our budget as our response to these disparities.

In 2021, as Covid continued to impact our world, the Missions Committee remained committed to providing direct support to our partner organizations involved in feeding people, while also contributing to other organizations we have partnered with for many years. We also responded to the people of Kentucky after tornadoes ravaged their state, to Haiti when an earthquake struck and to Afghan families relocating to Connecticut. We are also a community who believes that relationships, both with members of our church community and with our partner organizations are at the heart of who we are as a community of faith. We build those relationships by identifying and participating in hands on opportunities that bring us in direct contact with the people our Mission partners serve.

During a lull in Covid cases, we were able to organize a Breakfast Run to feed the homeless poor in New York City, participate in the ABC House carwash which raises funds for graduating seniors as they go onto college and to revitalize the yard of a home in Bridgeport through Homefront. We also provided school backpacks and supplies for kids in Bridgeport, bags of candy for the annual Christmas party at the Fraternite of Notre Dame in Harlem, Stop & Shop and Walmart gift cards for foster families in Bridgeport and Christmas gifts for kids in Bridgeport.

Christian Education at Talmadge Hill Community Church

Children and Youth Education

Each Sunday morning at the 10:00 service of worship, children attend the service with their families. Before the sermon, children are invited to the front of the sanctuary for a message and prayer for the children. This ritual is intended to celebrate their presence before they proceed to Sunday School.

Our Sunday School program is geared for our younger children (Pre-K through the 5th grade). The **Godly Play** curriculum anchors the learning experience for the younger class, using interactive play, a spirit of curiosity and wonder, and storytelling to illuminate the essential teachings and lessons of our faith.

Sunday School classes will typically have 2 adult leaders and is taught by Jeanne Altman.

Adult Education

Throughout the year there is a Bible Study on Thursday mornings at 9:30am and a Contemplative Prayer in Community gathering over Zoom on Wednesday evenings at 5:00-6:00pm. There are also several Adult Ed series held on Monday evenings from 7:00-8:30pm that include book studies as well as teaching and discussion of topics such as Race & Racism, Forgiveness, and how the 12-Step model can be used as a framework for spiritual formation. *Please check the online calendar for our current offerings*.

Women's Circle

We invite you to join our wonderfully diverse group of women whether you participate in the worship life of the church or not, you are welcome to join the women of Talmadge Hill for our gatherings. **All women are welcome!**

We meet monthly on Saturday mornings throughout the year between to share our lives and support each other on our spiritual journeys.

We have an annual retreat day in the Spring where we focus on deepening our spiritual connections to one another and to our God.

Every year, there is an annual Women's Circle Retreat that usually takes place in late Spring.

All women are also welcome to join a Covenant Group. Covenant Groups consist of 3-8 women and meet regularly (approximately every two weeks) to share life in relationships characterized by safety, trust, vulnerability, authenticity and transparency. They are called "covenant" groups in order to establish that they are based on grace (not law), built on love (not fear), are nourishing (versus limiting), rely on mutual accountability and need affirmation in order to live

Men's Cornfield

The men of Talmadge Hill have been gathering each month for nearly twenty years, warmly welcoming any man who wishes to have a deeper connection to his life, his work and his family. It has been called the "Cornfield" which is a reference to the book *Illusions* by Richard Bach in which two men landed their biplanes in a cornfield to learn the deeper mysteries of life through their conversation and personal exploration.

Meetings take place on the first Saturday of the month throughout the year and are open to Talmadge Hill members and non-members. **All men are welcome!**

Each meeting includes a welcoming that invites each man to "check in" and let the other men know what's happening in his life. Usually a question is posed to invite deeper reflection on our lives, our faith and our relationships.

Throughout the year the men of the church plan, organize or support activities for the greater benefit of the community.

- Organization for the annual HomeFront Day–refurbishing a home for a qualifying family in Bridgeport
- Hosting the annual Father's Day All Church Picnic

Every year, there is a Cornfield Men's Retreat Weekend that typically takes place in the Spring.

Sunday Ushering and Hospitality at Talmadge Hill Community Church

One of the ways to serve the community is by ushering and hosting the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Worship Service and Coffee Hour.

Your efforts make our church community the wonderful experience that it is. The responsibilities are listed below. Plan to arrive 15 minutes early to prepare the following:

- Please bring a simple arrangement of flowers for the altar. If you would like a person to be honored or memorialized by the flowers, please email Linda at talmadgehillchurch@gmail.com by the Wednesday prior to your commitment and identify the person to be honored. Please spell the name so we can print it correctly in the bulletin.
- Set up the coffee_for after the worship service. Instructions are posted by the coffee machine.
- Welcome people and distribute bulletins. The last pew will be reserved for you. Please remain there to greet latecomers and watch the door. Extend a warm welcome to visitors and new members and if they are coming alone, please introduce them to a current church member that might invite them to coffee hour. Off them a new member card to fill out if desired.
- Take the collection. Kindly wait with the plates at the back of the church until Rob plays the doxology.
- Serve simple refreshments after the service in the Merritt Room. Plan on 65-75 people from September to June; 50 people in the summertime.

Being a Steward

Supporting the Ministries of Talmadge Hill Community Church

Those who have followed Jesus have always seen themselves as stewards, just as Jesus himself claimed that he was here to serve. The word "steward" refers to someone who cares for the needs of the "household". Naturally, as a part of our tradition we become those who care for our Household of Faith, to serve.

Why Support THCC?

A diverse group of individuals participate in, and enjoy, the program life at Talmadge Hill Community Church (THCC). We celebrate not only the diversity of our congregation, but also the spirit that draws so many of us into a deeper exploration of our spiritual lives.

When someone chooses to become a member of THCC, the ground shifts in subtle yet meaningful ways. Of course, one is free to be a part of anything, and everything, that we offer. But at the same time, one has intentionally joined the community of **stewards**. In other words, one is not simply a welcomed participant. One becomes necessarily more – summoned to support, protect, and contribute to the life of our church for its immediate and long-term well-being.

Stewardship has been part and parcel of the church's vocabulary for a long time. Too often, the word has been reduced to a synonym of fundraising. This is ill conceived and misleading. Stewardship is primarily about **identity**, and our deepest calling to receive from God's abundant grace while consciously and generously contributing to the same. In large measure, our contributions are channeled through the community of faith. The community of faith gives us a place to worship, a place to learn, a place for our children to be shaped, outlets for service to the marginalized of the world, and much more.

None of these gifts is sustainable without the generosity of our members. The impact of our church shrinks without the contributions of its summoned stewards. Those contributions include time, talent and financial resources. Are these contributions a requirement of membership at THCC? They are not. But as one of the great saints of the church once said, "Love cannot thrive with cautious observers. Love is an impassioned commitment of mind, body and spirit." Stewardship is the same. It is the promise of a joyful and impactful living.

To What Are We Giving at THCC?

Your support of the ministries of Talmadge Hill Church makes all our ministries possible. The list of opportunities and services at THCC is impressive. We are proud of how we serve our members, friends, and the larger world. Here are a few examples:

We believe a meaningful financial commitment at any level is about owning a stake in the spiritual community that nourishes our lives and our families. What matters is the presence of thoughtful reflection, a willingness to play one's part, and a desire to be generous. A member (steward) of the church pledges to give as an act of love and a deeply felt sense of responsibility.
